

આ વર્ષની આપણી અલગ-અલગ પ્રાથમિકતાઓ વિષે આપ સાથે વાત કરવા માગું છું.

રિસર્ચ:

આગામી સમયમાં ચેમ્બરના માધ્યમથી આપણે વ્યાપાર-ઉદ્યોગ વિષયક આપણું રિસર્ચ વધુ સઘન કરવા માંગીએ છીએ અને તો જ આપણે સરકારશ્રીને પણ અનેકવિધ નીતિવિષયક બાબતો અન્વયે યોગ્ય રજૂઆત કરી શકીશું. રિસર્ચ અન્વયે આપણા પ્રયત્નો થકી આપણે મેળવેલ Recognition, સરકારશ્રી સમક્ષ આપણી રજૂઆતોને પણ વધુ વિશ્વસનીય બનાવશે તેમજ સરકારશ્રી પણ નીતિવિષયક નિર્ણય લેતી વખતે આપણા દ્વારા કરવામાં આવેલ રિસર્ચ પ્રક્રિયાને પ્રાધાન્ય આપશે.

આપણાં પ્રતિનિધિમંડળઃ

મારી દષ્ટિએ આપણા માટે માત્ર આપણા અન્ય દેશો સાથેના પ્રતિનિધિમંડળ તેમજ વાર્તાલાપ જ અગત્યના નથી, પરંતુ સાથે-સાથે આપણે આપણા દેશના જ અન્ય રાજ્ય સાથે પણ આપણા પ્રતિનિધિમંડળ તેમજ વાર્તાલાપ થકી અનેકવિધ વ્યાપાર-ઉદ્યોગની તકોનો લાભ લેવા માગીએ છીએ. આપણા દેશ પાસે આપણું પોતાનું જ એક ખૂબ જ વિશાળ માર્કેટ ઉપલબ્ધ છે, જેનો આપણે ચોક્કસ લાભ લેવો જોઈએ. થોડા સમય પહેલાં જ આપણા કેન્દ્રીય ગૃહમંત્રી શ્રી અમિતભાઇ શાહે સૂચન કરેલ કે આપણી ચેમ્બરનું પ્રતિનિધિમંડળ આપણે કાશ્મીર મોકલવું જોઈએ જે સૂચન આપણે ખુબ જ ઝડપથી અમલમાં મૂકવા પ્રતિબદ્ધ છીએ.

સાથે-સાથે અન્ય દેશો સાથેના આપણા પ્રતિનિધિમંડળ તેમજ વાર્તાલાપ પણ તેટલાં જ અગત્યના છે. હાલમાં જે એક વિચાર ખૂબ જ પ્રવર્તમાન છે તે છે 'China Plus One', જેનો હેતુ ચીન પર આધારિત ના રહેતાં INDIA એકમાત્ર Major Supplier બને તે પર આપણું ધ્યાન સવિશેષ હોવું જોઈએ. અન્ય દેશો સાથે પણ વ્યાપાર સંબંધો મજબૂત કરવાનો છે, પરંતુ આપણે જો ભારતીય અર્થતંત્ર તેમજ તેના અભૂતપૂર્વ વિકાસ પર નજર નાખીએ તો આપણું ધ્યાન 'Only India Policy' પર સવિશેષ હોવું જોઈએ.

ટૂંક સમય પહેલાં આપણા કેન્દ્રીય આરોગ્ય મંત્રી શ્રી મનસુખભાઇ માંડિવયા સાથે આપણી વાતચીત થયેલ અને તેઓએ કરેલ સૂચન પ્રમાણે આપણે ટૂંક સમયમાં રશિયા ખાતે પણ આપણું પ્રતિનિધિમંડળ લઇ જવા માંગીએ છીએ તેમજ સાથે-સાથે આફ્રિકા તેમજ ઇઝરાયલ સાથેની પણ અનેકવિધ તકોનો આપણે ઉપયોગ કરવા માગીએ છીએ.

વ્યાપાર-ઉદ્યોગના આપણા પ્રશ્નોની યોગ્ય તેમજ સચોટ પરિણામલક્ષીરજુઆતઃ

સરકારશ્રી તેમજ અન્ય વિભાગો સમક્ષ વ્યાપાર-ઉદ્યોગના આપણા પ્રશ્નોની યોગ્ય રજૂઆતનો આધાર પણ આપણા દ્વારા કરવામાં આવેલ ઘનિષ્ઠ રિસર્ચ પર રહેશે. આપણે જો તમામ પ્રશ્નો વિશે યોગ્ય અભ્યાસ કરેલ હશે તો જ આપણે તેની સચોટ રજૂઆત પણ કરી શકીશું અને સાથે-સાથે આવી રજૂઆત પછી આપણે એટલું જ પ્રાધાન્ય તે પછીના ફોલો અપને પણ આપીશું.

આપણે જયારે આપણા પ્રશ્નોની રજૂઆત કરીએ ત્યારે આપણે તે પણ ધ્યાનમાં રાખવું પડશે કે જયારે આપણે વૈશ્વિક અર્થતંત્રનો અગત્યનો હિસ્સો બનવા પ્રતિબદ્ધ છીએ ત્યારે આપણી રજૂઆતો પણ એવી ન હોય કે જે વૈશ્વિક પ્રેક્ટિસથી વિરુદ્ધ હોય.

सक्यवृद्धिः

ચેમ્બરની આપશી સભ્યસંખ્યામાં વૃદ્ધિ અંગે પણ આપશે સંખ્યા કરતાં ગુણવત્તાને વધુ પ્રાધાન્ય આપવા કટિબદ્ધ છીએ તેમજ સાથે- સાથે છેક છેવાડાનો વ્યાપારી પણ આપશો સભ્ય બને તેમજ આપશે તેઓના પ્રશ્નોની યોગ્ય રજૂઆત કરી તેનું નિવારણ કરી શકીએ તે આપશું ધ્યેય રહેશે.

સ્ટાર્ટ-અપ એકમોનો સર્વાંગી વિકાસઃ

આપણે સૌ જાણીએ છીએ તેમ ભારતીય અર્થતંત્રના નોંધનીય વિકાસમાં આપણા સ્ટાર્ટ-અપ એકમોનો સિંહફાળો રહેલ છે. તે બાબત નિર્વિવાદ છે કે ભારતીય અર્થતંત્રને પ ટ્રિલિયન ડૉલર અર્થતંત્ર બનાવવા માટે, રોજગારની અનેકવિધ તકો ઊભી કરવા માટે તેમજ વિકાસના લાભ છેક છેવાડાના માનવી સુધી લઇ જવા માટે આગામી સમયમાં 'સ્ટાર્ટ-અપ' એકમોનું યોગદાન ખૂબ જ નોંધનીય બની રહેવાનું છે અને આ બાબતને ધ્યાનમાં રાખીને જ આપણે સ્ટાર્ટ-અપ એકમોના વિકાસ માટે એક ખાસ વ્યવસ્થા ઉભી કરવા માગીએ છીએ, જે થકી વર્તમાન સ્ટાર્ટ-અપ તેમજ આગામી સ્ટાર્ટ-અપને યોગ્ય સાતત્યપૂર્ણ માર્ગદર્શન તેમજ શક્ય તમામ સહાયતા મળી રહે. આ આપણી એક અગત્યની પ્રાથમિકતા બની રહેવાની છે.

આપણે આપણા પોતાના G-Hub (ઇન્ક્યુબેશન કેન્દ્ર)ની સ્થાપના કરવા પણ કટિબદ્ધ છીએ. જે થકી આપણે ગુજરાતના જ અનેક નાના સંશોધક તેમજ સ્ટાર્ટ-અપ એકમોને મદદરૂપ થઈ શકીશું તેમજ તે થકી ગુજરાતના જ આગામી Unicorn એકમોના નિર્માણમાં આપણું યોગદાન આપી શકીશું.

નિષ્ણાતો દ્વારા માર્ગદર્શન:

આપણે ચેમ્બરના માધ્યમ થકી આપણા સભ્યશ્રીઓ તેમજ જાહેર જનતાને વ્યાપાર-ઉદ્યોગને લગતા અલગ-અલગ વિષયો પર નિષ્ણાતોને આમંત્રિત કરી તેઓનાં સલાહ-સૂચન સભ્યશ્રીઓને મળી રહે તેવી ખાસ વ્યવસ્થા ઊભી કરવા માગીએ છીએ.

ચેમ્બર પાસે આપણા સભ્યો તરીકે જ અનેક નિષ્ણાતો ઉપલબ્ધ છે. આપણે તેઓ પાસેથી અપેક્ષા રાખીશું કે તેઓ નિયમિત રીતે ચેમ્બર માં ઉપસ્થિત રહીને આપણા સભ્યોને અલગ અલગ વિષય પર માર્ગદર્શન પૂરું પાડે.

આપણા પોતાના જ આ અન્વયે સમગ્ર વર્ષ દરમિયાન અનેકવિધ સેમિનાર, પરિસંવાદ, વર્કશોપ, રાઉન્ડ-ટેબલ વગેરેનું આયોજન તો થશે જ તેમજ સાથે-સાથે આપણા હેલ્પ-ડેસ્ક થકી અને જરૂરી અન્ય હેલ્પ-ડેસ્ક ની સ્થાપના કરી આપણે દરેક વિષયને લગતું ચોક્કસ માર્ગદર્શન પૂરું પાડવા કટિબદ્ધ છીએ.

ચેમ્બરનું સચિવાલયઃ

ચેમ્બરનું આપશું સચિવાલય (Secretariat) આપણી તમામ પ્રવૃત્તિઓમાં તેમજ સભ્યશ્રીઓને સહાય તેમજ માર્ગદર્શન પૂરું પાડવામાં આગવી ભૂમિકા ભજવતું આવ્યું છે. સેક્રેટરીએટ દ્વારા પૂરી પાડવામાં આવતી સેવાઓમાં અનેકવિધ સેવાઓનો ઉમેરો કરવાના આપણા પ્રયત્નો રહેશે.

આપણું પોતાનું ઇન્ડસ્ટ્રી કન્વેશન એન્ડ રિસર્ચ સેન્ટર હોય તે આપણું લાંબા સમયનું સ્વપ્ન છે. આ સ્વપ્ન સાકાર કરવા આપણે આ વર્ષે જ જમીન મેળવી તેમજ આગામી વર્ષ દરમ્યાન ગ્રીન બિલ્ડિંગનો પાયો નાખવા કટિબદ્ધ છીએ.

ગુજરાત ચેમ્બર ઓફ કોમર્સ એન્ડ ઇન્ડસ્ટ્રી કન્વેશન એન્ડ રિસર્ચ સેન્ટર પણ આપણી આ વર્ષની એક ખૂબ જ અગત્યની પ્રાથમિકતા છે, જે થકી આપણે અનેકવિધ પ્રવૃત્તિઓ પણ કરી શકીશું તેમજ





સાથે-સાથે ચેમ્બર દ્વારા થતી સંશોધનની પ્રવૃત્તિઓને પણ તીવ્ર વેગ આપી શકીશું.

સર્વિસ સેક્ટરઃ

Our executive committee consisted of 114 members and we tried to get at least 40% new members in the team consisting of leaders of industries, office bearers of leading associations and experts in various fields to carry out our events and activities, we formed 51 committees and task force for logical working.

In my installation speech, I had committed to working on four pillars and throughout the year we followed the same principle of Developing Business, Knowledge Enhancement, Advocacy and Strengthening GCCI Infrastructure.

The highlights of work done during the tenure includes

- Foreign Delegations: 18 foreign delegations including 6 ambassadors visited the chamber.
- Membership: We enrolled 691 new members.
 We were able to renew 97% of our membership and organized Sabhya Setu every quarter for induction and networking of new members.
- New Helpdesk: Launched 3 new helpdesks of

Defence, Environment and Technology Transfer Platform.

- Representations to Government: We made 276 representations of which 201 were made to state government, 51 to central government and 7 to local corporations. I am happy to share that we could resolve many issues through these representations like representation for rule 9, problem of toy retailers, an extension of dates for various deadlines etc.
- ADRC: We started a new initiative for handling conciliation matters and were assigned 400 cases. We concluded 180 matters in 3 months.
- Seminars & Webinars: Organized around 50 seminars and Webinars.
- Exhibitions: We had signed an MOU with Messe Muenchen of Germany to partner with them for their exhibitions in Ahmedabad and under this partnership, we did four exhibitions.
- Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav: Celebrated 75
 years of independence and mandated 'AZADI
 KA AMRUT MAHOTSAV' by organizing many
 events and seminars under the same.
- Open House with Government Authorities: Undertook 6 interactive sessions/Open House meetings with the government authorities.
- Regional Chamber Interactions: Many regional chamber meetings were organized and through the Regional council we made several representations including a reduction of GST on textiles and garments.
- Interactions with Trade and Industry
 Associations: Meetings of office bearers of
 various associations with the executive
 committee members of our association also





took place and have initiated the work of the Association member's directory.

- Support MSME for Defence: Conducted Webinars with all the 16 Defence PSUs to understand their procurement policies and the products they are looking for.
- Industrial Visit: Undertook 15 industrial visits with a focus on a particular area of knowledge.
- Training Programs: Started a new initiative of conducting training programs under the Centre for Learning committee and within a span of three months, we have successfully completed 3 training programs.
- B2B Meetings: Arranged B2B meetings and vendor development programs with large PSUs like ONGC etc.
- Skill Development: We also arranged a seminar to create awareness of various incentives given by the government for skill development.
- CSR-Support to Covid Widows: We also distributed business kits to 56 COVID widows.
 Our CSR team identified 6 projects which are unique and has long-term impact and the same was circulated to the members.
- Member's Connect: We started a regular monthly E-bulletin which gives an overview of activities during the month. We re-designed the bi-monthly bulletin with meaningful articles and circulated the same to over 7000 readers.
- BWC: Business Women Committee worked excellently, organized 25 programs and enrolled 54 new members.
- Youth Wing: Youth Wing performed exceptionally and organized 30 programs.

They increased their membership from 40 to 300 members.

- **GCCI IT Upgradation**: To strengthen GCCI we introduced new software for efficient working and also redesigned the website.
- Admin & HR: Various SOPs were introduced to have systematic working and reporting and revamped HR policies.

The COVID pandemic and the Ukraine war have created many challenges but has also created great opportunities. All countries are now looking for C+1 option and India would be their natural choice. Similarly, the European countries are affected by the Ukraine war and will have to look upon India. This has created a great opportunity for all Indian businessmen in almost all sectors. We should work hard and make the maximum out of these opportunities.

To fulfil the vision of a 5 trillion economy, our government has also been very supportive and bringing various PLI and incentive schemes and is also opening doors by signing Free Trade Agreements with various countries which will give a great boost to Indian industries. Also with a vision on Atmanirbharta in Defence, there is a great opportunity for our MSME and Defence sector. I urge all members to take benefit of these opportunities.

I congratulate the incoming team of Shri Pathikbhai Patwari, President, Sr. Vice President Shri Ajaybhai Patel and Vice President, Shri Yogeshbhai. I am confident that with the leadership of the new team, the next few years will be golden years for GCCI.

Although my term as President is over, I will always be available for any support and guidance to come.

The members of GCCI, Presidents of Regional Chamber of





MSMEs plays a very crucial role in helping to achieve the Sustainable Development goals in particular, Promoting innovation, creativity and decent work for all. So the UN general assembly on 6th April, 2017 in 74th plenary meeting adopted the resolution to observe 27th June as the micro, small and medium sized enterprise day or MSME day. The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSME) is a highly vibrant, dynamic and drive sector of the Indian economy with over 6.5 Crores unit, providing employment to 11 crores + people. It contributes 30% of GDP and 40% of exports.

The Government of India has a Systematic institutional management to promote MSMEs which covers a legislative and regulatory framework, which provides following key provisions

- 1. Establishment a national board for micro, small and medium enterprises needed by the ministry of MSME.
- 2. It provides legal framework for recognition of the concept of "Enterprise: it defines there layers of enterprise namely Micro, Small and Medium.

Ministry of MSME formed a working group under chairmanship of DG LIPA in 2020 to examine the whole issue in particular post covid and recommendations. Pertaining to classification, registration, constitution of national board and state level monitoring, exemption clause, liquidation, procedure, online grievance, redressal, knowledge management and "EASE OF DOING BUSINESS"

Schemes for MSMEs 2022-23 Government of India Ministry of MSME

Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP)

- The scheme aims to provide financial assistance to set up self-employment ventures and generate sustainable employment opportunities in rural as well as urban areas
- To generate sustainable and continuous employment opportunities to rural and unemployed youth as well as prospective traditional artisans and thereby halt occupational migration.
- Bank-financed subsidy program for setting up new micro-enterprise in non-farm sector.
- Margin Money subsidy on Bank Loan ranges from 15% to 35% for projects up to Rs. 50 Lakh in manufacturing and Rs. 20 Lakh in the service sector.
- For beneficiaries belonging to special categories such as SC/ST/Women/Minorities/Ex-Servicemen/ Transgender/aspirational districts/NER, the margin money subsidy is 35% in rural areas and 25% in urban areas.

- Credit guarantee for loans up to Rs. 2 crores, without collateral and third-party guarantee.

- Guarantee coverage ranges from 85% (Micro Enterprise up to Rs. 5 lakhs) to 75% (others).
- 50% coverage is for retail activity.



The Govt. of India has introduced the Modified Market





Development Assistance (MMDA) scheme w.e.f., 3rd Quarter of 2016-17 under which 30% is provided as grant on Prime Cost of Khadi & Polyvastra. MMDA Scheme aims at decontrolling and de-linking the sales price from the Cost Chart thus offering scope to the Institutions to add value to Khadi; so that the products can be sold at market oriented prices.

(B) Interest Subsidy Eligibility Certification

- To provide funding for khadi programme undertaken by khadi institutions by mobilizing funds from banking institutions for filling the gap between the actual fund requirements and availability of funds from budgetary sources.
- Credit at the concessional rate of interest is made available as per the requirement of the Khadi Institutions (KI) to mobilize additional requirements of fund from the Financial Institutions/Banks.
- The KI is required to pay only 4% interest rate. The difference between the actual Interest charged by the Bank and 4% is borne by the KVIC as "Interest Subsidy".

(C) Work-Shed Scheme for Khadi Artisans

- To facilitate and empower khadi spinners and weavers to chart out a sustainable path for growth, income generation and better work environment.
- To provide better ambience by providing a better workplace to artisans to enable them to carry out their spinning and weaving work efficiently.
- To provide more storing and working space for housing slivers, raw material, implements etc.

2) Gramodyog Vikas Yojana Scheme

(A) Pottery Activity

- To increase the production, technical knowhow of pottery artisans and to reduce the cost of production.
- To enhance the income of pottery artisans by providing skill development training and modern and automated equipment.
- To provide skill development training to SHGs of potteryartisans on focused products like garden pots, khullad, decorator products etc.
- To encourage the successful potter to set up his own unit under PMEGP scheme.

(B) Beekeeping Activity

- To adopt scientific bee management practices.

- Process and Product development in relevant sector.



MSME Champions Scheme

The ZED Certification envisages promotion of Zero Defect Zero Effect (ZED) practices amongst MSMEs so as to:

- Encourage and enable MSMEs for manufacturing of quality products using latest technology, tools & to constantly upgrade their processes for achievement of high quality and high productivity with the least effect on the environment.
- Develop an Ecosystem for ZED Manufacturing in MSMEs, for enhancing competitiveness and enabling exports.
- Promote adoption of ZED practices and recognising the efforts of successful MSMEs.
- Encourage MSMEs to achieve higher ZED Certification levels through graded incentives.
- Increase public awareness on demanding Zero Defect and Zero Effect products through the MSME Sustainable (ZED) Certification.

2) MSME-COMPETITIVE (LEAN)



MSMEs

Micro, Small, Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) are the backbone of National & State level economy. They contribute significantly to economy and offer huge employment opportunities. Gujarat ranks 1st in integrated overall performance of MSMEs at National Level, as per ISED Small Enterprise Observatory Gujarat received 2nd highest share of over 16.2% in the total number of entrepreneurs memorandum filed the MSMEs across India The MSMEs entrepreneur memorandums received by Gujarat has grown by 193% in last five years Gujarat has several Multi-Product MSMEs clusters.


Challenges faced by MSMEs

The MSMEs in general and those in Gujarat face several challenges. The main challenges include tough competition in a dynamic & open market, lack of adequate market share, access to finance, access to technology and others.

Innovation is the Key

One of the key reasons for this lack of adequate market share, as has been observed, is having the same set of products & services year over year. The competitive scenario, financial constraints and small scale of operations requires the MSMEs to be innovative. The innovation does not have to be very big. Small innovations which are


relevant, which add value and thereby generate demand are crucial strategic factors.



Creating value in the Market Place

When a MSME entrepreneur goes for such innovations, an Intellectual Property (IP) is created. And in today's competitive scenario, it's the innovation based IP which provides MSMEs the desired competitive advantage.

A competitive advantage is crucial for an MSME's growth and expansion pursuits. For instance, getting a trademark for an MSME's products or services may reflect the quality that it accounts for. This would establish trust and goodwill associated with the brand among consumers. Additionally, this may also accelerate consumer loyalty. Thus, protecting an MSME's IP is an effective strategy to set it apart from other businesses in a particular industry

Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs)-Effective Tool for MSMEs

Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) are the rights given to persons/firms over the creations/innovations of their minds. They give the creator an exclusive right over the use of his/her creation for a certain period of time. IPRs are important instruments to foster a culture of innovation. They offer protection of innovations by MSMEs by giving them the Ownership.

IPRs include mainly Patents, Trademarks, Industrial designs and Copyrights. Protecting them enhances the competitiveness of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). Patents are considered more important because they directly improve the competitiveness of MSMEs

Conventionally, Indian Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) have relied on creating and protecting tangible assets-from land, machinery to office equipment-together with their revenue and receivables, to boost their valuation and prestige among their peers and in the industry.

Common Mistakes Firms Make in Regard to Protecting Their Intellectual Property

Not property identifying all of their intellectual property.

Not legally protecting the intellectual property that needs protecting. Not fully recognizing the value of their intellectual property.

Not using their intellectual property as part of their overall plan for success.

However, as per global experience, MSMEs have catapulted into the big league of large enterprises by transcending borders, that is, Multinational Corporations (MNCs), when they invest in creation and protection of intellectual properties (IP) and intellectual property rights (IPRs).

MSMEs should look at IPRs as legal monopoliesinvestments in which will allow them to be ahead of their competition as IPRs, being negative rights, out rightly stop others from practising, using or selling any product or service that infringes on any of their IPRs. Here, it is important to point out that all MSMEs, of any trade or industrial segment, are capable of having one or more kinds of IPRs in their portfolio.

The three pronged strategy for MSMEs:

Innovation backed by IPR

- Creation of Intellectual Property : Small Innovations which are relevant and adds value
- Protecting the Innovations under Intellectual Property Rights – Patents/Trademarks/Designs/Copyrights
- Now with IPR protection, these MSMEs hold a competitive advantage having ownership of their innovations. That provides MSMEs a better access and higher share of their target market.

Following are the main IPR components useful to MSMEs

Trademarks

Having an enforceable or registered trade mark is an intellectual property right that all MSMEs are capable of creating, protecting and enforcing. Every business has a trademark or a logo or any mark that distinguishes them from their peers, among their customers/clients and registering it can just ensure that nobody else in their trade or industry is able to use that mark anymore and this exclusivity allows the MSME to attach goodwill, of quality product/service, to that mark at lower costs.

Industrial Design

Another IP asset that MSMEs can easily acquire is that of Industrial Design rights. This IP asset pertains to shape, design or ornamentation of any article or product. This IP asset is driven to protect only the aesthetics of an article or a product; such as creating a new shape or design or ornamentation of furniture, a water bottle; of dials of wrist watches; of a suitcase; of a bag.

Patents

MSMEs, especially, those engaged in manufacturing are capable of creating patentable assets too. A monopoly of this kind is very likely to put any MSME ahead of their competition as they can stop anyone else in their industry from using that patented product, machine or process in



their (competitors') factories. Such an asset holds the potential of opening another revenue vertical or opening a new market by way of licensing.

Getting IPR now is easy with an excellent support ecosystem

India has world best IPR policy and set up to grant examine and grant IPRs. The main office is the Controller General of Patent, Trademarks, Designs, others under the Department of Industrial Promotion & Policy (DIPP), Ministry of Commerce; Government of India.

The Indian Government has taken various steps for promoting knowledge and facilitating IPR protection amongst MSMEs including various amendments in the laws, modernising IPR Offices and digitisation for filing applications for protecting IPRs

For MSMEs, filing and getting Patents, Trademarks, Design registrations, Copyrights are now totally online and much easier. The links are:

Mentoring & Financial support

Further, mentoring and financial support from IPR facilitation centres and Government is available. Both the Central and Gujarat State Government offer financial assistance for filing Patents. For example, Commissioner of Industries, Government of Gujarat offers financial assistance up to 75% of the cost incurred towards filing a patent from Gujarat. This is on reimbursement basis. (Requested to check eligibility & other terms)

In September-2019, the Government announced a reduction in fee for the filing of IPRs by MSME enterprises. The reduction amounted to about 60 per cent in cases of patents to 50 per cent for designs. The official fees for trademark applications are already reduced by 50 per cent for MSME enterprises. The intent of government policy is to encourage more and more MSMEs to protect their IPRs.

Also, of the above IP assets, the assets such as trademark, industrial design and patents, can be easily acquired by any

interested MSME by licensing or purchasing them from universities or peers or even from lone inventors. Indian MSME owners must, therefore, seriously look into acquiring such assets from marketplace, when they think of expansion of their business.

Conclusion

The key advantages of IPR for MSMEs include:

- Acquiring an exclusive competitive edge
- Increasing market value of the patented/design registered products/services and also of the company as a whole
- Entry in to and share of newer market segments including at international level
- Preventing competitors from copying their inventions
- Creating a distinct corporate identity by branding strategy backed by Trademark.
- Enhanced and Better access to finance

The acquisition of IP assets is actually acquisition monopoly rights in that particular trade. The investment in creating, filing, registering and acquiring IP assets by MSMEs can put them in lucrative position such as that of sole suppliers to their purchasers of their patented product, for example, sole suppliers to defence ministry, universities, public laboratories, automobile makers, Pharma companies etc. for their patented products.

The acquisition of such assets and their valuation, as done by a trained and recognised IP valuer, can be included in balance sheets, financial and annual reports for the benefit of investors. In the age of entrepreneurship, MSMEs in India must get on the bandwagon. A one-to three-year-old Startup, with no land or office or machinery or equipment to their name, obtains higher valuation than most MSMEs in business since generations, from serious investors, largely on account of such intellectual monopolies that they hold in terms of trademarks, goodwill, designs, patents and copyrights.

It is important that MSMEs view IPR protection as an investment to create an asset rather than an expense. Creation of an IP portfolio would not only make an enterprise more competitive but will also enhance its valuation for future merger and acquisitions



Importance of Succession Planning for SMEs

India has a vast base of around 6.33 crore MSMEs, most of such business are family-run enterprises. These MSMEs are employing more than 45 percent of the country's workforce, are working relentlessly to make an impression in the global market, with risk-taking being a part of their entrepreneurial DNA. However, the disconnect between passion and reality and the lack of a structured framework to pass on the business legacy to the next generation are placing these MSMEs at risk of survival,".

Amid changes in the overall business environment over the past few years in India such as demonetisation, GST implementation, Covid pandemic, economic downturn, etc., the need for succession planning is more critical than ever. Also in today's globally competitive and modern environments, organizational future plans often fail due to the lack of succession planning. Succession planning is one of the most critical factors for MSMEs especially in the current climate, where the business environment has undergone a transformation and there is a lot of unpredictability.

Very few organizations survive without proper succession planning. A number of leading business houses like GMR, Burmans, Thapars and many others have realised the importance of business succession planning. Globally, in the West as well as Asian countries today the business families are conscious of the importance of business succession planning. Succession planning is quite important for the continuity and prosperity of business. Dealing effectively with the issue of succession planning is the single lasting gift that one generation can bestow upon the next.



According to report as many as 35 per cent MSMEs feel succession planning is their biggest problem. Succession planning defines how the business will be run in your absence and it is one of the most consequential steps you will ever take as a business owner. Ultimately, the goal is protection. You want to protect what you've built, your vision and the livelihoods of your employees.

First and foremost, the founders and promoters of family-owned businesses need to be aware and conscious of the fact that a day will come when they will have to retire from the business or may not be in a position owing to medical or other unforeseen reasons to run the daily business routine. Accepting the fact that they may have to cede control of the business someday is not an easy fact for the promoters of family businesses to accept. In such circumstances, either the businesses will need to be run by the next generation after they are properly trained or management will have to be passed to external professionals. This may prove to be a difficult task to achieve and its on-ground implementation may require a lot of introspection and debate.

- i) A carefully-drafted succession-planning scheme can ensure that business continuity is not impeded and the value of the business is not eroded on account of disruptions caused by natural or man-made factors.
- ii) Succession plan is a tool in facilitating a hassle-free transition and transfer of business ownership from one generation to another. Succession plans act as a viable blueprint in defining the vision of the business over a span



of several generations. They are also useful in laying the groundwork for clearly demarcating the rights and responsibilities between different members of the family. A well-defined succession plan also ensures in retaining the promoter stake in the company, preventing liquidation of family assets and preserving their value.

iii) Promoters of family-owned businesses will need to be aware of the fact that today we are living in a world, which is highly compliant and businesses are expected to run and abide by rules and regulations which are legally binding. Succession planning can help in attaining the crucial task of compliance mapping in a family enterprise and help it run in a transparent and ethical manner, creating and unlocking unprecedented value.

iv) As business passes from one generation to another, legal battles are bound to be the natural outcome of differing opinions and ego hassles. Succession planning can help in formulating an efficient dispute resolution mechanism, which can provide solutions at various stages of the business and succession.

It's therefore essential that the planning process starts early and is thorough and transparent. It doesn't help if you've done all the work and no one knows where to find it, and the transfer of a business shouldn't be a time for guesswork. Speak to a lawyer or financial advisor with experience in these matters and who will be able to manage the process and clearly communicate its outcomes.

It is important to keep personal and business affairs clearly

separated. Many small business owners blur the lines between personal and business accounts, credit and assets. It's understandable but will make the succession process considerably more complicated. Effective succession planning depends on a degree of separation between owner and business. Draw up a personal will that is clearly separate from the affairs of the business.

Once you've found an advisor you trust, make sure they understand your unique circumstances. You'll want to discuss the nature and size of your business, state of indebtedness, family situation and crucially, your goals and desires for the transfer of your business. Then you can work with them to quantify those goals, and finally to put proper plans and arrangements in place.

Finally, document processes and procedures. Who do you call when things go wrong? The next owner needs to know that. Who are your contacts? What business opportunities were you pursuing? The more that is explicitly recorded, the better off the business will be. If you have a successor in mind, put in place a training programme that involves introducing them to your accountants, lawyers and bankers. It helps if your support network knows where to turn and in whom you've placed your trust.

It might feel as though the business you have built is inseparable from you. But with forethought, planning and the right advice, the transfer of your business will herald the next phase of its growth, and the further realisation of your vision.

Enhancing competitive advantage of Indian MSMEs, among other things, is important to realize the mission of Atma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyan. The Government of India is channelizing resources and strategy and also addressing the policy and governance issues to achieve the mandate outlined in ANBA. However, there are enterprise-level problems/requirements and the prevailing ecosystem has not adequately addressed those issues. As a result, MSMEs do not get optimal solution to their problems and their growth prospects get seriously affected.

Therefore, it is proposed to deal with this problem at the level of individual enterprises and help them graduate to the next level; micro to small, small to medium and medium to large through engagement of business development service providers. There are number of Volunteering organizations in developed countries providing Senior Experts in developing countries for SMEs problem solving in technical, managerial, finance etc. They depute senior experts having wide experience, knowledge and hands on experience in different fields after matching SMEs requirements. Below is the overview of such organisations.

An Overview of Senior Experts Organisations

1. The Netherlands Senior Experts Organisation (The PUM)

• The PUM provides entrepreneurs with advice for the sustainable development of their business. That is what they do as a volunteer organisation.

This is how they support companies:

The PUM clients want to grow their business. In order to do that, they often need to collaborate with an expert. PUM's



experts are all volunteers who provide clients with practical advice and support them in applying it. Experts and clients work together, for as long as it takes until the client has enough knowledge to continue on their own.

Advice on location

The PUM regularly help entrepreneurs who are happy to receive remote advice. Each one receives individual support from a PUM expert via Skype, email or telephone.

• Train the Trainers Seminars

Entrepreneurs who want to share their experience and knowledge with their peers can count on PUM support and offers "Train the trainers" seminars for local experts to go





on and train companies themselves. In this way, they can use their own expertise to support and grow other companies.

Vocational education

The PUM offers specialised support for clients who work in vocational education and find it difficult to connect with the business world. PUM has a lot of experience in strengthening the cooperation between companies and vocational education.

Business Incubators

The PUM have something to offer for companies which have been around for less than 2 years. For example, PUM can put them in touch with a business incubator in their area. The PUM also directly support business incubators with training and organisational advice.

Business Links

A PUM expert can invite clients who see opportunities for international trade to the Netherlands. There they can meet potential business partners. The PUM expert will also help them find the right companies to, for example, purchase machines, products or ingredients.

Hans Blankert Fund



Business Deductions Under Income Tax Act, 1961



CA Sulabh Padshah Member, Direct Tax Comm.

- The word `Business' is defined under section-2(13) of Income Tax Act, 1961, it expressly provides to include any trade, commerce or manufacture or any adventure or concern in the nature of trade, commerce or manufacture. To establish the activity as a business activity, it must have characteristics of dealings either actually continued or contemplated to be continued with the object of profit and not just for sport or pleasure.
- Here, I have made an attempt to deal with issues arising while claiming the expenditures under section-30 to section 37 to derive the income under the head Business & profession as under:

<u>Section-30</u> - This section deals with eligibility of expenditures incurred in form of Rent, Rates, Taxes, Repairs & Insurance of Buildings used for business purpose.

- i. Rent of the premise is allowed as deduction, however, notional rent paid by proprietor is not allowed as deduction. But rent paid by him to his partner for using his premise is allowed as deduction.
- ii. Current repairs if the assessee bears the cost of repairs are allowed as deduction. However, Capital repairs incurred by the assessee are never allowed as deduction whether premises is occupied as a tenant or as a owner.
- iii. Any sum on account of Land Revenue, Local Taxes or Municipal Taxes subject to Section-43B. As per Section-43B deduction shall be allowed only if such sum is actually paid on or before the due date of furnishing or return; and

iv. Insurance charges against the risk of damage or destruction of building is allowed as deduction.

<u>Section-31</u>: This section deals with eligibility of expenditures incurred in form of Repairs & Insurance of Plant, Machinery & Furniture used for business purpose.

- i. Current repairs to the plant, machinery and furniture is allowed as deduction, however, capital repairs incurred by the assessee are never allowed as deduction whether plant is leased or is purchased.
- ii. Premium paid for insurance against the risk of damage or destruction of plant, machinery or furniture is allowed as deduction.

<u>Section-32</u>: This section deals with eligibility in respect of depreciation of-

- (i) buildings, machinery, plant or furniture, being tangible assets;
- (ii) know-how, patents, copyrights, trade marks, licences, franchises or any other business or commercial rights of similar nature, being intangible assets acquired on or after the 1st day of April, 1998, [not being goodwill of a business or profession]

owned, wholly or partly, by the assessee and used for the purposes of the business or profession, the following deductions shall be allowed.

• It is very important to note that with effect from 1-4-2021, the Goodwill has been specifically excluded for the purpose of claiming depreciation u/s 32 and thus the depreciation on Goodwill is not more allowable under the Income tax Act, 1961

Section-36: Other deductions -

- Section 36(1) deals with the allowability of expenditures incurred towards Insurance of Stock that the amount of any Insurance premium paid in respect of insurance against risk of damage or destruction of stocks or stores used for the purposes of the business is allowed as discount.
- Similarly, Section-36(1)(ib) deals with the allowability of Insurance premium paid on the health of employees is also allowed as deduction.

Both the above deductions u/s 36(1) are allowable subject to if following conditions are satisfied:

- The Premium is paid by Cheque by the employer; and
- Premium is paid under the Scheme framed in this behalf by the General Insurance Corporation of India and approved by the Central Government.

- Section-36(1)(ii) deals with the allowability of expenditures incurred towards Bonus or commission paid to employees, which is allowable as deduction subject to -

Admissible only if not payable as profit or dividend: One of the conditions is that the amount payable to employees as Bonus or Commission should not otherwise have been payable to them as profit or dividend. This is provided to check an employer from avoiding tax by distributing his/its profit by way of bonus among the member employees of his/its concern, instead of distributing the sum as dividend or profits.

Deductible on payment basis : Bonus or Commission is allowed as deduction only where payment is made during the previous year or on or before the due date of furnishing return of income u/s 139.

- Section-36(1)(iii) deals with the allowability of expenditures incurred towards Interest on borrowed capital
- Interest accrued before the commencement of business not allowed ad deduction but has to be capitalized and added to the actual cost of fixed assets acquired out of borrowed capital.
- Similarly interest accrued after the commencement of business but before the asset is put to use is not allowed as deduction but has to be capitalized and added to the actual cost of the fixed assets acquired out of borrowed capital.
- Income tax department cannot question the need for borrowing and the rate of interest.
- Interest accrued after the asset is put to use is allowed as deduction u/s 36(1)(iii) irrespective of the treatment in books of account
- Interest other than interest on borrowing is allowed as deduction u/s 37 and not under this clause such as Interest on late payment of tax etc.

- Section-36(1)(vii) deals with the allowability of Bad Debts in case of sale proceeds are no more recoverable subject to following conditions:
- The assessee is not required to establish that debt has become bad; it is enough if bad debt is written off as irrecoverable in accounts of assessee.
- A deduction will be allowed in respect of any Bad Debt which is written off as irrecoverable in the account of the assessee for the previous year subject to the conditions specified in Sec. 36(2) as follows:
- No such deduction shall be allowed unless such debt or part thereof has been taken into account in computing the income of the assessee of the previous year in which the amount of such debt or part thereof is written off or of an earlier previous year, **E.g.** Credit Sale made Rs. 50,000/though accounted in books of accounts of that financial year, however now it is not realizable, then this sale of



Rs.50,000/- offered as income in earlier year, is now eligible for deduction under this section.

- Also note that the Advances made for purchase of stocks. Advance forfeited not allowed as deduction since advance money not a part of income. However, deduction can be claimed u/s 37.
- Provision made for Bad Debt in books of accounts is also not allowed deduction
- Where a deduction has been allowed in respect of a bad debt or part of debt, then, if the amount subsequently recovered on any such debt or part is greater than the difference between the debt or part of debt and the amount so allowed, the excess shall be deemed to be profits and gains of business or profession, and accordingly chargeable to tax under Section-41(4), whether the business or profession in respect of which the deduction has been allowed is in existence in that year or not.
- Now the law is settled for claiming Bad debt that the assessee is not required to establish that debt has become bad; it is enough if bad debt is written off as irrecoverable in books in view of decision of Supreme Court in case of T.R.F. Ltd Vs CIT 323 ITR 397/190 Taxman 391 and as per the CBDT Circular No. 12/2016 dated 30th May, 2016.

Section-37

- Section-37(1) deals with the allowability of expenditures incurred –
- Wholly and exclusively for the purposes of the business or profession
- Not being expenditure of the nature described in sections-30 to 36 and,
- Not being in the nature of capital expenditure or personal expenses of the assessee.
- Further any expenditure incurred by an assessee for any purpose which is an offence or which is prohibited by law, no deduction or allowance shall be made in respect of such expenditure, irrespectively incurred for business purpose or not.
- Also, any expenditure incurred by an assessee on the activities relating to corporate social responsibility referred to in Section-135 of the Companies Act, 2013 (18 of 2013), such expenditure shall not be considered as

business expenditure and no deduction shall be allowed in this regard.

Sanrhea Technical Textiles Limited-A First Generation Company into Premium Quality Technical Textile Manufacturing & Supply

According to a report published by Invest India, the global demand for technical textiles was pegged at \$165 billion in the year 2018 and is expected to grow up to \$220 billion by 2025, at a CAGR of four percent from 2018-25. In India, the technical textile market is worth 19 Bn and growing with every year. The major factor driving and securing the onward growth is the major thrust the current government has given to the Infrastructure, Roads and Rail Projects. This will automatically assure a secure growth in the market for a very wide range of Industrial Fabrics.

However, when it comes to industrial fabrics, quality and timely delivery are the elements for sustenance in the market. There are multiple producers in the native market but not everyone has the expertise or experience to aptly meet client demands. Sanrhea Technical Textiles Limited from Gujarat is a Self Made First Generation company established by a family of age old repute in Textiles in the country. The company has been in the market since 1997 and is now a trusted manufacturer in this segment. Tushar Patel, Managing Director, Sanrhea Technical Textiles says, "In the segment we are in, it's all about Quality & Delivery. Our performance on both these issues has been the bone of our success. There have been instances where we have been able to give delivery to our customer within two days of a SOS demand. As a policy we maintain a certain quantity of woven but unprocessed fabric of all our regular customers. This helps us at such times".

OPERATIONAL EXCELLENCE

All of Sanrhea's products are customer-specific, which is something no other vendor is doing. When the company entered the field, a very large segment of rubber component manufacturers had to make do with fabrics as available and then adapt accordingly. Sanrhea instead worked on designing and making products as per the



critical specifications of the customer. And then, as far as the quality standards are concerned, the company always attempts to exceed the customers' expectations. It is reverse engineering fabrics, based on the specific and critical requirements of the customers. The company operates a full-spectrum QC regimen, covering all procedures involving inward and outward materials flow and entailing periodic in-line tests and stringent monitoring.

The company manufactures several kinds of fabrics for the Conveyor Belting, Tyre Chafer, Marine and Auto Component Industry. Sanrhea's USP is that its products are always customer specific. On certain products the company has worked for over two years with the customer, to reach a stage of final perfection and establishment. Also, its delivery commitments on very short notice are something nobody else in the industry can match. As far as fabrics for very critical applications like Boats, Floats, Brakes and Air-Cells, where the dynamic balance of the fabric is very important, the MD thinks that the company is most established, if not the only established and approved manufacturer in India. "We are constantly looking out for new products. Sanrhea's vision is to concentrate and establish 85 percent of its product profile in the Specialised Fabrics segment. All new growth plans are only with such new products in vision. We are currently working on certain specialised fabrics catering to certain different Automobile components", mentions the MD. Sanrhea has already established these fabrics on a semi commercial scale and are producing about 10-15 tons/month. However, conservative outlook that it has, Sanrhea is waiting for a consolidation of some more time. It does see itself adding a new line of 100-150 tons/month, catering to these new developments.

According to Tushar, Conveyor Belting Fabrics had historically been over designed. This not only assured a secure and long-term belt strength, but also benefited the





vendor with a higher volume of sale and a higher margin. When Sanrhea as textile technocrats entered the field it sat with its conveyor belt customers and reworked specifications of the entire Belting Fabric Range, based on the actual required specification and it brought down the fabric grammage by almost 10-15 percentage which is direct cost saving. "We are currently working on a fabric for an Of Shore Marine Inflatable, where 16 layers of fabric are utilised to make the final component. We are jointly working with the customer to make the same product with a fabric redesigned by us and the target is to achieve the same results with 8 to 10 layers of fabric", he states.

Sanrhea has the most enterprising and driven team most of which has grown from in-within. There's never a NO in their vocabulary. According to the MD, "If someone is doing it, then why can't we! With a technically sound and driven team like this, we made it our endeavour to reverse engineer fabrics, specific to each customer needs. We didn't look at volumes, but instead made it our drive to give each customer what he needs. This assures the customer with a better and more cost effective product and assured us the confidence and a secure long term association with the customer".

GROWTH STORY

Starting-off its corporate journey in Industrial Textiles as a small convertor in 1997, Sanrhea today has grown into one of the most reputed and established manufacturers of RFL Dipped Fabrics in India, with a current installed capacity of 180 tons per month. It started off as a company with absolutely no experience, knowledge or technical tie-up in this field. All Sanrhea had was a very driven team with a strong textile background, and one that saw scope in this segment. Its initial years as converters for established manufacturers of Conveyor Belting and Chafer Fabrics gave it immense knowledge and in-site in the line, as well as the onwards processing and application of the fabrics they were making. The company saw that fabric made in its plant was onwards being processed and supplied to the prime

tyre industry or conveyor belt customers by its convertors. This gave Sanrhea the confidence of putting up its own RFL Dipping Plant and entering into the end product market. In fact, it ended up designing and setting up the Dipping Line entirely by itself in assistance with a closely associated Textile Engineering company. Effectively, the company was able to set up the plant at 25 percent the cost of importing the same. "Our growth has been slow, but since we were a new company in this segment, we opted to tread with caution. We grew from internal accruals and have maintained a debt-free status. However, this has lead us today into becoming a secure and solid manufacturers catering to the most reputed of customers and producing the most specialised fabrics as per each customers critical requirements", mentions the MD.

Over the last year, Sanrhea has already implemented the required up-gradation and capacity installation to take itself from its current average achieved capacity of appx. 140 tons/month to 180 tons/month. It should be able to see the effect of this in the financial year 2022-2023. Subsequent to this, the company is also working on installing its additional 100-150 tons new capacity to cater to the new products that are currently under semi-commercial approval. Its vision for growth is already set and the company is striding ahead with the same caution it has grown with till date.

LOOKING AT THE FUTURE

With the growth of the Indian economy, demand on each segment the company is currently in, is going up. To keep up pace with this the company is also looking at increasing its capacity of the current products range. "Further, it has been a constant endeavour within us to keep developing newer and more efficient products for our customers. Various exercises are in the trial stages with a very positive response from the customers. Based on these the company is actively working on adding an additional capacity of upto 150 tons/month of these additional RFL Dipped Product range", concludes the MD.

PHD Chamber's Report on 'Ease of Doing Business for MSMEs in India: Percolating EODB Reforms at Factory Level'

Ease of Doing Business for MSMEs steady, digitization help significantly; Overall Ease of Doing Business for MSMEs at the scale of 100 is 64; manufacturing MSMEs at 67 and service MSMEs at 61

PHD Research Bureau of PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry, in collaboration with the Department of Commerce, Delhi School of Economics (DSE), Delhi University, has conducted a survey Study on 'Ease of Doing Business for MSMEs in India: Percolating EODB Reforms at Factory Level'. The Study is based on a pan India stratified random sample survey of MSMEs from manufacturing and services sectors, through a structured questionnaire on 25 parameters of ease of doing business. According to an extensive survey of more than 5,000 MSMEs, the overall EODB for MSMEs has been observed at 64 on the scale of 100, of which EODB for manufacturing MSMEs is at 67 and service MSMEs is at 61. The survey reveals that the adoption of digitization has been the top scoring parameter for ease of doing business for manufacturing MSMEs, followed by availability of information on business procedures & compliances, adequate power supply availability, process of tax registration and tax compliances and availability of Infrastructure (internet, telecom and other utilities).

The top scoring parameters for ease of doing business for services sector MSMEs include availability of information on business procedures & compliances, processes and procedures for starting a business, regulatory environment, dissolution of business and adoption of digitization. Whereas, the low scoring parameters for ease of doing business for manufacturing MSMEs came out to be the Government support for marketing, reduction in time taken to obtain credit and reduction in cost of power. On the services sector MSMEs front, the low scoring parameters for ease of doing business include cost of compliances, reduction in time taken to obtain credit and reduction in the overall costs of doing business.

The survey Study has been released recently by Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti, Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India and Ms. Sumita Dawra IAS, Additional Secretary, Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India.

For further enhancing the ease of doing business for MSMEs, the report has suggested the following measures:

1. Nodal officers for handholding- There is a need for dedicated officers for Facilitating Domestic and Foreign

Companies.

- 2. One-time registration and no license-There should be a one-time registration instead of issuing a license every year for renewal which causes a lot of time and effort.
- 3. Merger of all 25-30 departments in a Single Window System for approval- To start a business, there should be one window clearance instead of running after 25-30 departments.
- 4. Inspector/officials to be an Enabler, Motivator and Guide-The inspector should be an enabler, motivator, and guide for improving the business and giving positive confidence to the investors.
- 5. Speedy and timely Justice for litigation under GST and other laws- The various Departments should not be allowed to issue summons/notices without a valid reason. The litigation should be time-bound and speedy.
- 6. Reservation on Local Labour- Employment should be productivity linked. Local reservation on labour must be abolished in states in order to provide justice to skilled employees if hired from outside the state. Recently, the declared "reservation policy" in Haryana is one example.
- 7. Fixed Term Employment-Fixed-term employment provision announced by Government of India but the State should fully implement it at the ground level.
- 8. Uninterrupted Power and Gas supply-to ensure uninterrupted power and gas supply to the industrial areas at reasonable rates.
- 9. Decriminalisation of the minor offences will significantly improve the EODB in the Country
- 10. Bank Financing for setting up new projects- clear cut instructions should be issued and there should not be unreasonable collateral requirement for the loans disbursed to the businesses
- 11. Lesser compliances for MSMEs will create visible ease of doing business at the ground level and a lower tax regime will increase the personal disposable income of the people and create an overall virtuous circle of growth and development in the economy.
- 12. PLI Scheme should include more sectors from manufacturing for the benefits of businesses/industry.
- 13. Simplification of land acquisitions is required as it remains complex, because of the difficulties in establishing legal ownership and a 'clean' holding for purchase.
